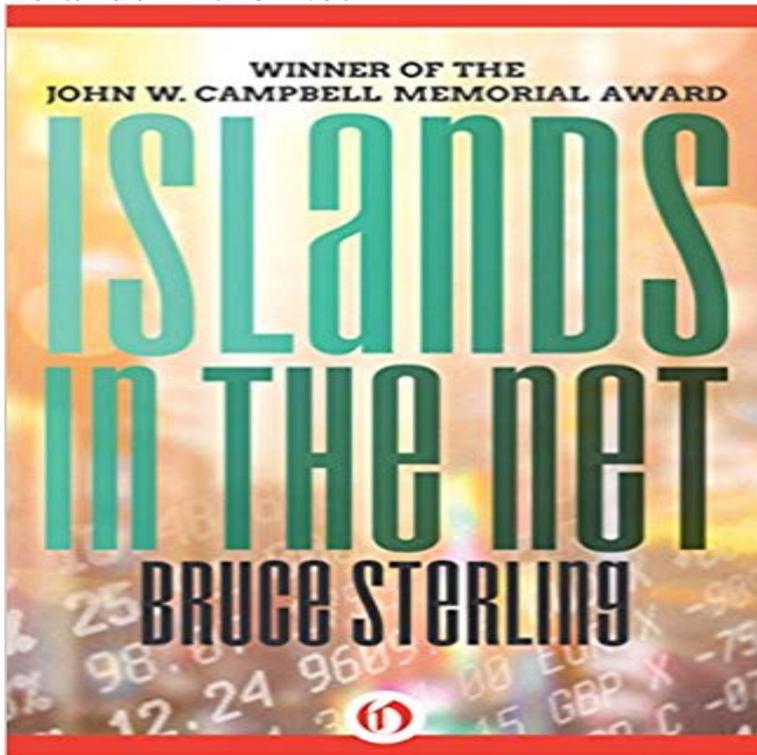


Islands in the Net
