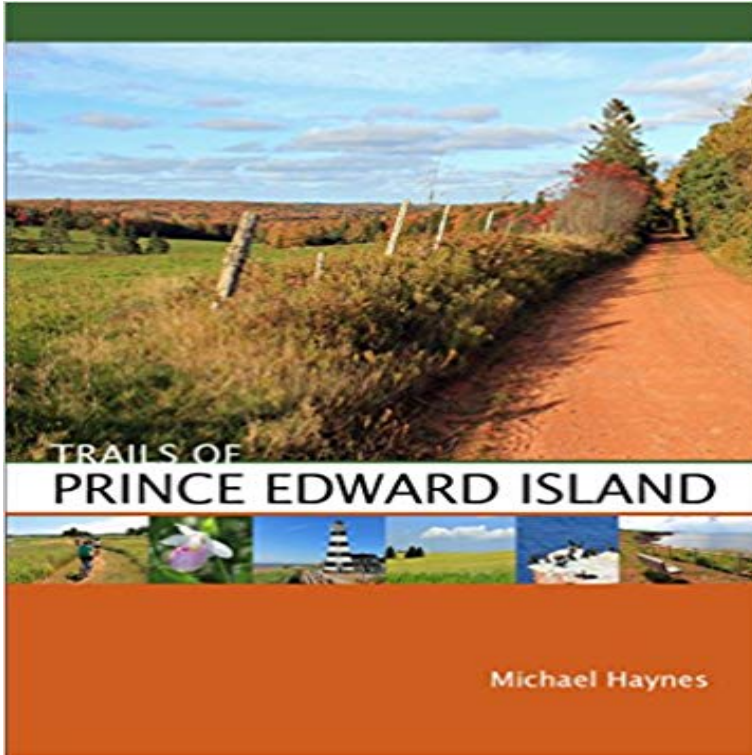


Trails of Prince Edward Island
