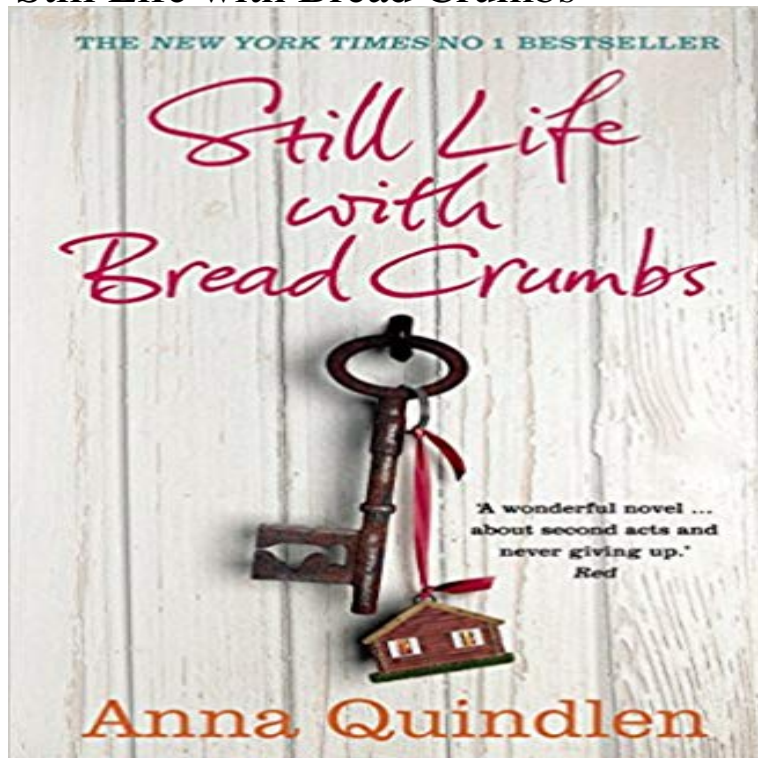


Still Life with Bread Crumbs
