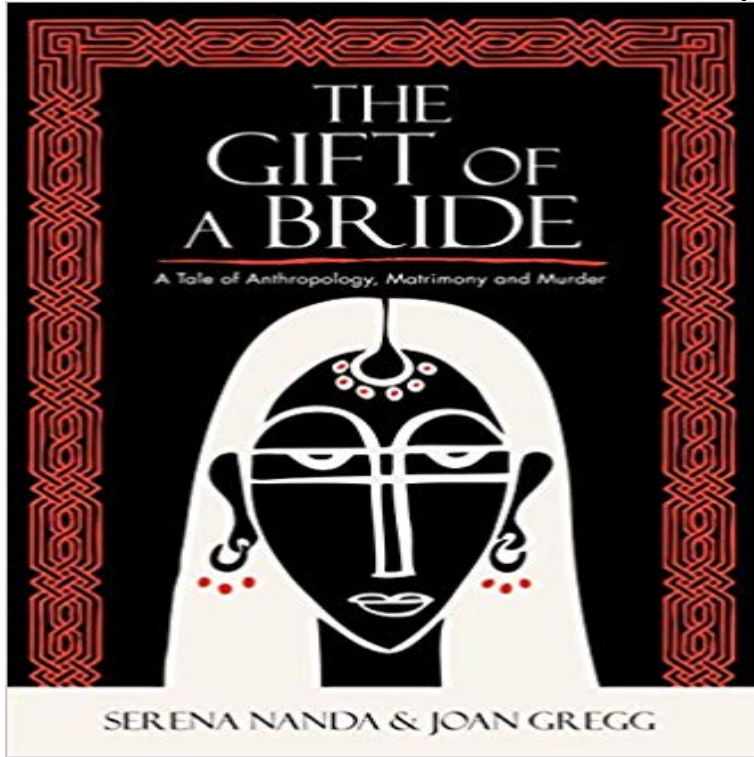


The Gift of a Bride: A Tale of Anthropology, Matrimony and Murder
