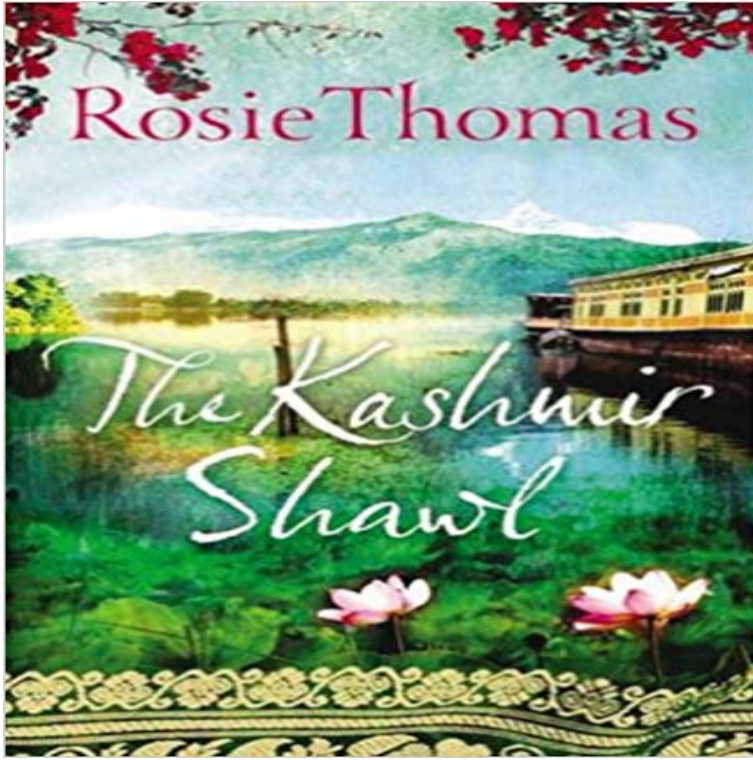


The Kashmir Shawl: A Novel
