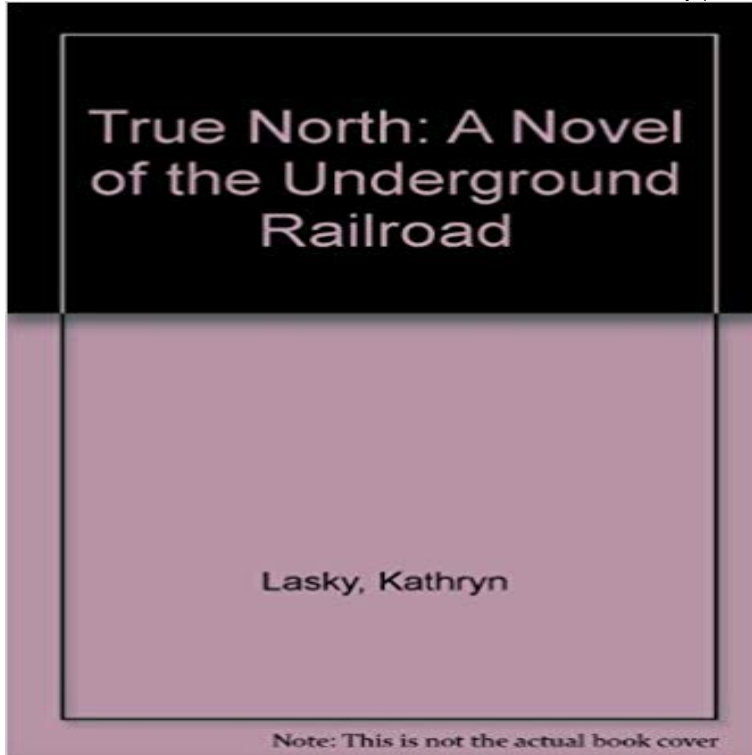


True North : A Novel of the Underground Railroad
