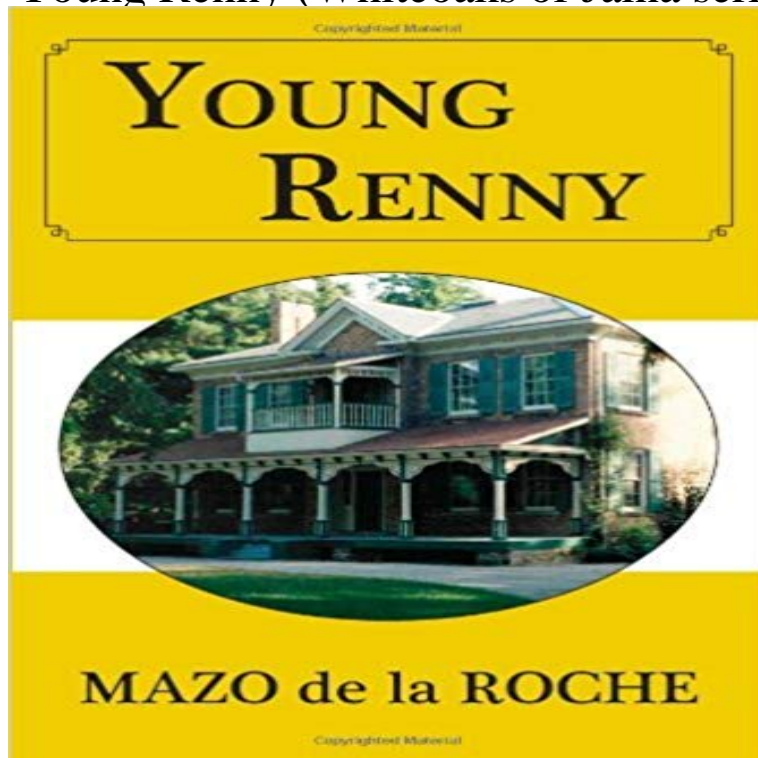


Young Renny (Whiteoaks of Jalna series)
